section 2 below. All national groups contributing to scientific and technical process in acoustics may be considered as "societies".

1) Membership

The societies listed in the preamble are founder-members of the Federation of Acoustical Societies of Europe, abbreviated "FASE". Other scientific or technical societies working in the field of acoustics in Europe may also become members. Applications are decided upon by the Council.

2) Purpose and Goals

It is the purpose of FASE to promote progress in acoustics by coordinating activities of its members.

3) Constitution

a. Council

The Council of the Federation is composed of one representative from each country of which one association at least is member of the Federation. If a country presents more than one society member of PASE, the national representative is appointed jointly by all the societies of the country belonging to FASE. The member societies having no representative at the Council can design their delegate, one from each society, who can attend the meetings of the Council as an observer with only consultative right.

b. President

The President of the Federation is elected by the Council and will hold office for three consecutive years. He cannot be re-elected immediately.

c. Secretary

The Secretary of the Federation is elected by the Council for three consecutive years. Exceptionally, the first elected Secretary will hold office for four years. The President and the Secretary must be members of the Council.

4) Society meetings, congresses and symposia open to international participation organized by societies will be announced to all members of the Federation. Hembers of other societies will have the right to attend all these meetings and to present papers.

These papers can be refused only on the same grounds as those applying to papers of members of the organizing The accepted languages must include in these cases English, French, German and Russian.

"European congresses on acoustics" covering any field may be organized; the official languages will be English, French, German and Russian.

- 5) Co-operation with ICA

 FASE will maintain close co-operation with ICA in the organization of meetings and in other activities.
- 6) Resources
 The Council may impose membership dues.
